She will be missed tremendously in Pleasley and New Houghton.



Between 8 and 9.30 am 237 vehicles entered New Houghton from the north. 18 were going faster than the CSW threshold and were reported to the police. 10 were actually travelling at 40mph or above with one doing 47mph. Only one transgressor was a local resident.

## Update on the situation with the roof at St Michael's Church. October 2025

Friends, I would like to begin this by saying a huge thank you!! Thank you to all of you who have given money towards the repairs needed at St Michael's, it is really appreciated. And thank you also to Pleasley Parish Council who continue to allow us to use The Verney Institute for our regular Sunday Services and for our events.

So, where are we, and how long is it likely to be before we can re-open St Michael's??

As with roofing issues, it is advisable to ensure the work on the outside of the structure is done before starting on internal work. We are pleased to report that the external work needed to ensure the roof is sound has been completed. The cost of that work was circa £16K, which was raised through donations and by grant funding. We were also able to reclaim VAT paid on the work as we are a charity organisation.

We are now focussing on the funds needed to complete the internal work, likely to be somewhere in the region of £35K. We are hopeful of match grant funding towards this which lowers the target to around £17K – still a large sum, but achievable.

It would be wonderful to be able to reach this target by spring next year so that the work can

be carried out over the drier months. This will depend on our fund-raising efforts though so I would encourage you to look out for ways you can



support us in this – every penny donated goes directly to the repairs.

If you are a resident of the parish, you will shortly be receiving a Christmas card from us with details of our Advent and Christmas services. If you are not a resident keep an eye on our Facebook page for details. It would be wonderful to see you at those as we journey through this very special time of year together. We are having two services in St Michael's, (at the front where the roof is sound). Those will be very special times I am sure as we gather in the building once again.

Please do be in touch if you would like to know more, or chat to one of us at our events or services coming up. If you'd like to get involved in helping to fund raise or can offer any other practical help then do let us know also.
